Anglo-Saxon Literature and The Epic Stories were told orally in poem or song form (most people could not read or write) Stories provided moral instruction Anglo-Saxons spoke "Old English" Epic Poetry was one of the most common genres of literature during the period Beowulf was the most famous story to come out of the Anglo-Saxon era

Anglo-Saxons' arrival in Britain is unknown, because of the sporadic arrival of the various Germanic tribes and lack of documentation, but it is commonly assumed the Anglo-Saxon period dates from "AD 449 to 1066" (Raffel xi)

The Anglo-Saxon Period of English Law

THE ANGLO-SAXON PERIOD OF ENGLISH LAW We find the proper starting point for the history of English law in what are known as Anglo-Saxon times Not only does there seem to be no proof, or evidence of the existence of any Celtic element in any appreciable measure in our law, but also, notwithstanding the fact that the Roman occupation of Britain
